

Mid (south) area: At a glance




59,515 people
live in the catchment
of Fowey Community
Hospital



23% of people

condition**, compared with
18% across England.

More **people older than 65**
live in mid (south) Cornwall
than the England and South
West average.



26% of the population are
older than 65, compared
with 22% of the south west,
and 18% of England.



17% of households
have **no car**,
compared with 26%
across England.



People like living here
84% of people are
satisfied with their neighbourhood,
compared with 79% across England.



Mid (south) area: Key facts

The dependency ratio (ratio of non-working age) to working age of 0.74% is higher than England average of 0.59%.



Disability free life expectancy





Mid (south) population needs

Whilst some of the population needs are not unique to the mid (south) area and are in line with the England average, there are higher than the averages for people with mental ill health, older people, more rural residents and more older people living alone-with a significant number without transport. Loneliness and isolation may well be a significant factor to consider here.



19,793 residents (35.3%) are classified as being 'rural residents'. The England average is 10.5%, which has implications for isolation, community networks, access to community facilities etc.

Care homes

No extra care housing beds to provide an alternative to long-term residential care.

Two care homes and 67 beds, and 63 nursing beds have closed during the past two years.

Hospital admissions

From December 2017 to November 2018, 270 people had their discharge from hospital delayed.

19 admissions a month to hospital from care homes. 80 people receiving NHS Continuing Healthcare.
